GUIDELINES FOR AUTHOR'S FOR SUBMITTING PAPER FOR INCLUSION IN CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

LAST DATE OF SUBMISSION: 10th APRIL, 2019. (Extended Deadline)

Authors are requested to follow the submission guideline strictly.

General Information:-

A. Format and Page Layout

- **1. Word Limit:-** Each paper should be around 1800 words but should not exceed 2000 words in any case (all inclusive).
- **2.** Font and Size:- Use *Times New Roman Font*, Point 12. Main headings-14 and subheadings-12. Please use **BOLD** for paper title and section headings.
- **3. Spacing:-** Between every two lines 1.5 spaces must be maintained
- **4. Margins:-** Keep a margin of 2.5 cm from left and 2 cm on all other sides
- **5. Paragraphing:-** A blank line between paragraphs should be left without indent. All paragraphs should be aligned to both the left and the right margin.
- **6. Page Number:-** Page no is not necessary.
- 7. Do not include any header and footer.
- 8. Paper Size should be A4
- 9. Software: The paper should be written in MS word. Only files with .doc or .docx will be accepted.

B. Paper Layout

The paper should have the following sections:-

1. Title Page

The title page should include the following in the order given below

- o Name of the Paper
- The name(s) of the author(s)
- The affiliation(s) and address(es) of the author(s)
- o The e-mail address and telephone numbers of the corresponding author
- o **Abstract:** Please provide a structured abstract of 150 to 250 words;
- **Key Words**: Please provide 4 to 6 keywords which can be used for indexing purposes.
- 2. Introduction
- 3. Literature Review/Theoretical Background
- 4. Methodology (if needed)
- 5. Result and Discussions
- 6. Conclusion

- **7. Acknowledgments:** Acknowledgments of people, grants, funds, etc. should be placed in a separate section before the reference list. The names of funding organizations should be written in full.
- **8. References: APA style** (Please refer the recommended style.)
- 9. Appendices (e.g. Tables and Figures, if needed)

When writing the paper please remember to use UK English.

E. Tables

- All tables are to be numbered using Arabic numerals.
- Tables should always be cited in text in consecutive numerical order.
- For each table, please supply a table caption (title) explaining the components of the table.

• Identify any previously published material by giving the original source in the form of a reference at the end of the table caption.

F. Chart/Figure Numbering

- All figures are to be numbered using Arabic numerals.
- Figures should always be cited in text in consecutive numerical order.
- Figure parts should be denoted by lowercase letters (a, b, c, etc.).
- If an appendix appears in your article and it contains one or more figures, continue the consecutive numbering of the main text. Do not number the appendix figures, "A1, A2, A3, etc." Figures in online appendices (Electronic Supplementary Material) should, however, be numbered separately.

G. Chart/Figure Captions

- Each figure should have a concise caption describing accurately what the figure depicts. Include the captions in the text file of the manuscript, not in the figure file.
- Figure captions begin with the term Fig. in bold type, followed by the figure number, also in bold type.
- No punctuation is to be included after the number, nor is any punctuation to be placed at the end of the caption.
- Identify all elements found in the figure in the figure caption; and use boxes, circles, etc., as coordinate points in graphs.
- Identify previously published material by giving the original source in the form of a reference citation at the end of the figure caption.

H. Chart/Figure Placement and Size

• When preparing your figures, size figures to fit in the column width.

I. Permissions

If you include figures that have already been published elsewhere, you must obtain permission from the copyright owner(s) for both the print and online format

J. Plagiarism

The submitted paper must be plagiarism free and the author would be responsible for copyright violations. Please note, maximum permissible similarity % is 20%.
