The establishment of Gauhati University was the culmination of a prolonged movement by the people of Assam for a university of their own since the early years of the twentieth century.

The demand for a university was raised in many forums and over several decades. In 1917, presiding over the annual session of the Assam Association at Sibsagar, Satyanath Bora strongly advocated the case for a separate university in Assam. He pointed out that the Calcutta

University could hardly reflect the ethos and aspirations of the people of Assam. In fact, the Sadler Commission, while visiting Cotton College in 1917, remarked that Assam could not be expected to mould its national character and shape its courses and curriculum of study so long as it remained

The emblem of Gauhati University contains a wealth of meaning. Inscribed in it is the name of the University and its motto in two significant Sanskrit words Vidyaya Sadhayete 'Achieve through Learning.' Sadhayeta indicates that the learner is the rightful person (Adhikari) of the fruit of learning. The Ishopanishad states that one can attain immortality through learning or knowledge.

The Vision

under the academic control of Calcutta University. The matter was discussed in the Legislative Council for the first time in April, 1917. A resolution that Assam should have a separate university, was moved by Daiba Chandra Talukdar in the annual conference of the Guwahati Ekata Sabha, held at the Curzon Hall in 1928 under the presidentship of Karmabir Nabin Chandra Bordoloi. Assamese Learners' Welfare League, based in Calcutta, became very active during this time and the demand for the university in Assam gathered momentum. Assamese was then recognized only as a subsidiary subject in Calcutta University and the league was successful in making it one of the principal languages. In 1931, the MA classes in English in Cotton College were abolished and there was also a move to shift the Earle Law College to outside Assam. These moves irked the people of Assam and the demand for a separate university grew stronger.

A resolution was tabled for an Assam University in Assam Legislative Council on 17th March, 1935, but the government was not in favour of this because of financial constraints. A widely represented meeting, organized by the Assam Association and the Sangrakshini Sabha, was held at the Curzon Hall, Guwahati on 30th April, 1935 with Lokapriya Gopinath Bordoloi on the chair. The meeting called for immediate establishment of a university in Assam and decided to form a University Committee with the coordinated efforts of the Assam Association, the Assamese Learners' Welfare League and the University Action Committee of Nagaon, a movement was launched all over the state for establishment of a separate university for Assam. University Day was observed throughout the state on 22nd May, 1935 with processions and public meetings. The Government of Assam owing to increasing public pressure prepared two schemes, one by J.R. Cunningham, retired Director of Public Instruction, Assam and the other by Dr. S.K. Bhuyan. Neither of the schemes was found acceptable. However, Robertson, who was the principal of Murarichand College and who also served Assam as Director of the Education Department wrote in the annual report, "It is said, Assam cannot afford to have university of its own, it cannot afford not to have one". The initiatives for setting up a university were renewed after the Second World War. In December, 1944, the Gauhati University Trust Board was formed with Lokapriya Gopinath Bordoloi as its President. Bordoloi, ably assisted by Madhab Chandra Bezbaruah, Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed, Bhubaneswar Barua, Maheswar Neog and others, toured the entire Assam Valley and secured a promise of more than 16 lakhs rupees of donation. Of this, more than 5 lakhs were collected within a few months. Meanwhile, Bordoloi took over as the first Prime Minister of Assam in independent India. The formation of a popular government under the leadership of Bordoloi made the task easier and as the State's Education. Minister, Bordoloi moved the Gauhati University Bill. The bill was accepted in Assam Assembly on 15 October, 1947. The jurisdiction of Calcutta University and Decca Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education over Assam and the N.E. Region ceased with effect from 26th January, 1948. On this date, Prime Minister Bordoloi formally inaugurated the Gauhati University. The eminent scholar and educationist Krishna Kanta Handiqui joined the university as its first Vice-Chancellor and Phanidhar Dutta, a professor of Mathematics of Cotton College was appointed its first Registrar. The university started functioning from a building left behind by the military in the Cotton College campus. From 1948, the university had 18 affiliated colleges besides two professional colleges, the Assam Medical College at Dibrugarh and the Assam Agricultural College at Jorhat till 1955. That year, the university was shifted to its present campus at Jalukbari. Gauhati University could be established due to the aspiration of the people of Assam and their help and cooperation under the relentless and untiring efforts of a band of dedicated workers led by Gopinath Bordoloi, Madhab Chandra Bezbaruah, Sarat Chandra Goswami, Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed, Bhubaneswar Baruah and many others.

A UNIQUE HERITAGE

The unprecedented and spontaneous financial support of the public and their untiring involvement in the thirty-one year struggle, has thus, led to the establishment of Gauhati University. During the crucial initial years, this institution received the guidance of Krishna Kanta Handiqui, a pioneering indologist and philanthropist as its Vice Chancellor. V. Venkata Rao, Professor Emeritus, donated his life savings of about Rs. 15 lakhs for the promotion of higher education in the country through several universities. A galaxy of eminent scholars and administrators, such as Bani Kanta Kakati, Birinchi Kumar Baruah, Maheswar Neog, Satyendra Nath Sarma, Paban Chandra Mahanta, Hiten Barua, Rohini Kanta Barua and many others will always be remembered for their notable contributions to the academic world and to the development of the University. Over the years and across the decades since its existence, Gauhati University has emerged as a symbol of integration: it has offered opportunities of higher study to learners from the ethnically and culturally diverse mosaic of communities of the North East India.

LOCATION AND CAMPUS

The university is located at Jalukbari within the Guwahati city area. The campus has a hilly terrain on the southern side, with the river Brahmaputra flowing on the northern side. The campus is spread over an extensive area where one can take a quiet and leisurely walk along one of its numerous roads. The area has developed into a small township, known as Gopinath Bordoloi Nagar. It has now a population of about 15,000 including 3000 learners residing in the hostels. Besides the residential quarters of teachers, officers and employees of the university, 22 halls of residence of university are spread across the university campus. The necessary civic amenities such as health services, bus services, water supply, street lighting, internal roads, guest house, post and telegraph office, a branch of State Bank of India and Punjab National Bank, canteens, market, playgrounds, parks, indoor stadium, auditorium etc. are located inside the campus.

CONNECTIVITY

The University is 10 kilometers away from the Lokapriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport at Borjhar on the National Highway No. 37 and 5 kilometers away from the Kamakhya Railway station. The capital complex of Assam at Dispur, is 22 kilometers away from the university. The University is easily accessible from Guwahati city, which has road, rail and air links from all parts of the country. A large number of bus services from the various parts of Assam, terminate at Adabari which is less than 2 kilometers away from the campus. The Inter State Bus Terminus (I.S.B.T.) is also 10 kilometers away on the National Highway No. 37, on the way to Dispur.

2. GAUHATI UNIVERSITY CENTRE FOR DISTANCE AND ONLINE EDUCATION (GUCDOE)

With the motto of "Quality Higher Education for All", the Centre for Distance and Online Education (GUCDOE), the distance and online education wing of Gauhati University, aims at providing higher education in an intellectually challenging learning environment The centre was first established as the Post Graduate Correspondence School (PGCS) in the year 1998 with the objective of providing an opportunity to pursue quality higher education to a large number of learners who could not enroll themselves in the conventional system of higher education due to limited number of seats, livelihood compulsions, age barrier, financial constraints and many other factors. The centre was renamed as the Gauhati University Institute of Distance and Open Learning (GUIDOL) in 2008. In the year 2023, this institute has been renamed further as the Gauhati University Centre for Distance and Online Education (GUCDOE). GUCDOE has completed 25 years of its glorious existence since its inception, thereby catering to the needs of large chunk of ODL learners. Having a modest beginning with 514 learners and 6 courses in May, 1998, the centre has witnessed massive growth in all the capacities over the years. The centre provides a congenial learning environment, equipped with diverse up-todate learner support services. Apart from SLMs and counselling services, GUCDOE endeavours to maximize learning opportunities through various learner support services such as well-equipped library facility, ICT enabled classrooms, state of the art computer laboratory, Community Radio Service, wi-fi enabled campus etc. The journey from Correspondence School to Centre for Distance and Online Education, is not only a giant leap in terms of quantity but also in terms of quality and excellence.

4. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

GUCDOE provides admission through **Online Mode** only in all the programmes. For admission, a candidate may visit the portal: http://gucdoe.in/online admission

Step 1: Generate ABC ID

Visit https://www.digilocker.gov.in and follow the instructions to generate your ABC ID. Read the full instruction document:

Step 2: Generate DEB ID

Go to https://deb.ugc.ac.in/StudentDEBId, enter your ABC ID, and follow the instructions to generate your DEB ID.

Step 3: Registration

Enter your DEB ID, which will automatically fill in your Name, Contact Details, Date of Birth, and other information. Manually complete the remaining fields, such as Government Identity, Programme, and Study Centre/Learner Support Centre. After submitting, a payment challan will be generated.

Step 4: Pay Fee

Use the payment link to pay your fee. Leave the Roll Number field blank on the payment page.

Step 5: Declaration & Verification

Login to the dashboard with your Application No and Date of Birth. Enter the code from the challan and agree to the terms and conditions.

Step 6: Enter Details & Upload Documents

Enter your payment details and upload your documents, including your photo and signature. Submit the form at your study centre.

Step 7: Verification & Roll Number Generation

Submit your documents at the study centre for verification. After successful verification, you will receive your Roll Number.

Step 8: Collection of Study Material

After receiving your Roll Number, you can collect your study material from your study centre.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ONLINE ADMISSION

- 1) Scanned copy of Mark-sheets of the qualifying examinations.
- 2) Scanned copy of Pass Certificates of the qualifying examinations.
- 3) Scanned copy of H.S.L.C. Admit Card or Pass Certificate
- 4) Scanned copy of G.U. Registration Certificate (For the graduates of G.U. only).
- 5) Scanned copy of Govt. ID card (JPEG format)
- 6) Recent passport sized photograph (JPEG format).
- 7) Signature of the candidate (JPEG format).

Important note for IT Programme Aspirants:

- Admission into M.Sc-IT programme does not require any Selection Test. Eligible candidates should register themselves by visiting http://gucdoe.in (Online admission).
- Upon successful registration, a Centre visit slip will be generated. The student must visit GUCDOE with the Centre Visit slip, original documents and valid photo ID. The documents will be verified and signed by Document verifier. The signed slip must then be submitted at the Registration Desk for further processing and confirmation of registration.
- Selected candidates can proceed with admission into the programme by following the steps mentioned above (excluding the registration step).

4.1: REFUSAL OF ADMISSION

Notwithstanding any rules or procedure, a candidate may be refused admission if his/ her past conduct in this university or in any other University has not been satisfactory.

A candidate who has been expelled/rusticated or disqualified by this University or any other university earlier may also be refused admission.

4.2: CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION

Admission of a candidate may be cancelled at any stage if it is found that he/she does not fulfill the eligibility criteria and has furnished incorrect information or suppressed facts to secure admission or indulged in unlawful activities.

If any dispute arises out of such REFUSAL/CANCELLATION, the decision of the Honourable Vice-Chancellor, G.U., shall be final.

4.3: REFUND OF FEE

The Course Fee and other fees deposited by an admitted candidate, will not be refunded under any circumstances. However, any excess Fee wrongly deposited by a student, may be adjusted against his/her future dues.

4.4: IDENTITY CARD

On confirmation of admission, the learner will be issued Identity Card. The learners are required to carry their identity cards whenever they visit the GUCDOE or Study Centres and during examinations.

4.5: ROLL NUMBER

Learners admitted in GUCDOE, shall be issued a unique Roll Number. Learners are requested to quote their Roll Number in all the future correspondences and enquiry with GUCDOE.

4.6: REGISTRATION FOR CANDIDATES GRADUATING FROM OTHER UNIVERSITIES

Candidates who have passed their qualifying examinations from universities other than Gauhati University, shall be required to apply for Registration at Gauhati University, immediately after admissions. Applications for registration can be made through Online www erk4nep.oro Mode only. Candidates can apply for registration at **G.U. Portal**. No migration certificate is required for Registration. Registration process should be completed within 2 months from the date of admission.

5. LIBRARY FACILITY

The Library of GUCDOE is established to develop appropriate collection of books and other educational resources in various disciplines to satisfy the needs of the different reading communities of the institution. The library is one of the important central facilities of the institution. The library remains open from 09.00 am to 5.00 pm on all working days. Learners of GUCDOE are also entitled to consult the collection of the K.K. Handiqui Library, Gauhati University on production of their valid identity cards.

The library is automated with SOUL 2.0 Software, which is developed by the Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) Centre, an Autonomous Inter-University Centre (IUC) of the University Grants Commission (UGC). The primary mission of the library is to support the educational programmes of the institute by providing physical and intellectual access to information. In accordance with the objectives of the institution, the library aims to develop a comprehensive collection of documents, useful for the readers.

6. SCHOLARSHIP

Learners belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, Tea Garden, Minority Communities and differently abled are eligible for Government Scholarship. Their applications for scholarships, will be forwarded by the GUCDOE authorities to the Government Agencies/Departments for consideration.

7. EXAMINATION & EVALUATION

The GUCDOE is an integral part of Gauhati University. All examinations for GUCDOE Learners, are conducted as per the Rules and Regulations of Gauhati University by the Controller of. Examinations, G.U. All examinations, evaluation and assessment norms of conventional/regular mode courses of Gauhati University, shall also be applicable to GUCDOE learners. Learners will have to pass/clear their courses within 2N years of admission (N is the duration of the programme). Any query related to the examinations, may be made to the Controller of Examinations, G.U. through the Director, GUCDOE.

7.1: INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

As a part of the continuous evaluation process, the internal assessments will be conducted in each semester for **all the Programmes**. The internal assessment shall carry 20% and the term end examinations shall carry 80% weightage for each course/paper.

7.2: ADMIT CARDS

The learners at Gauhati University Examination Centre can download their Admit Cards before examination from the website www.gucdoe.in. Candidates appearing in the Examination Centres other than Gauhati University, will have to collect their Admit Cards from the respective Officer-in-Charge.

7.3: FEES TO BE PAID FOR SECOND/THIRD CHANCE AND BACK PAPER CANDIDATES

Candidates re-appearing in the examination of the all courses offered for second/third chance or Back/Betterment papers are required to pay an examination fee of Rs. 1000/- (Rupees One Thousand Only) for all categories, failing which candidates will not be allowed to appear in the examinations.

7.4: CHANGE/CORRECTION OF ADDDRESS AND OPTIONAL PAPERS

Any change/correction in the Address for Correspondence and Optional Papers, must be intimated to the GUCDOE, in writing.

8. MEDIUM OF LEARNING MATERIALS & EXAMINATIONS

The medium of learning materials (course materials and counselling) and examinations for all the courses, shall be English except for the M.A. in Assamese Programme.

9. SELF-LEARNING MATERIALS (SLM)

Printed study materials for various courses are in the SLM (Self Learning Material) format and the learners are provided with such materials so that fruitful interaction between the teachers and the students can be initiated through there. These materials are designed to be an appropriate substitute of the regular university classes and the 'teacher in print' will help the learners to learn their course themselves and subsequently, prepare themselves for the term-end examination. Learners should make the best use of SLMs by understanding the way they have been designed and developed. The objectives will first introduce the learners with the goals which they will reach after reading the unit. Then the various sections and subsections of the unit will follow. After each section there will be SAQs (Self Asking Questions) through which the learners can check their progress in terms of understanding the course contents. In between, there will be some boxes in which attempts will be made to impart the 'Extra' information which the learners need to acquire. Towards the end, there will be a list of references and suggested readings. Although the study materials are meant to be self- contained and self sufficient, learners can also consult the books and references for having a better grasp of the course contents.

Study Materials are supplied to the learners immediately after the admission either in person or by post. A learner can also get the Study Materials through the Study Centres in which he/she has taken admission. Study materials can also be downloaded from the GUCDOE official website.

N.B.: Please bring the admission receipt to collect the Study Materials for all the semesters.

10. PERSONAL CONTACT PROGRAMME

In addition to the Study Materials, Personal Contact Programmes are conducted which will enable the learners to clarify their confusions and ease their difficulties while going through it. Qualified faculty members of GUCDOE will help out the attending learners by providing necessary tips and guidelines during the interactive sessions. These sessions are also meant to give the learners a chance to meet the teachers personally and discuss their problems.

Though such programmes are not compulsory, learners are strongly advised to attend these programmes. GUCDOE has set up 99 different Study Centres in various parts of Assam and learners can join any one of the Study Centres which is nearest to them.

11. FLEXIBLE WALK-IN GROUP COUNSELLING (FWGC)

Regular group and individual counsellings are held in the GUCDOE complex during all working days. Learners may walk-in to the designated GUCDOE counselling room and meet their teachers to clarify doubts and attend the tutorial classes.

12. LEARNER SUPPORT CENTRES (LSC)/ STUDY CENTRES

The LSC are the backbones of the Learner Support Services. Usually, LSCs are located in its affiliated colleges. The centres facilitate admission, conduct counselling and act as liaison centres of the university for providing necessary information and guidance to the learners. LSCs are situated in most of the District Headquarters of Assam. These study centres operate as Information Bureaus which can be approached by the learners according to their convenience in terms of distance and time.

15. COMMUNITY RADIO SERVICE



RADIO LUIT 90.8 FM

Community Radio Service of Gauhati University

Community Radio is the third model of radio broadcasting beyond commercial and public broadcasting radio service. It broadcasts content which is popular and relevant to a local or specific audience but often overlooked by other media. Radio Luit 90.8 FM is the second Community Radio Station in Northeast India. It is a non-profit radio service. On 18th of January, 2011 Radio Luit started its trial broadcasting. After some days of practice, Radio Luit flagged off its journey formally on 1st March, 2011. It serves for community development with the active participation of the community in various aspects i.e. content management, programming and decision making of the radio station. Gauhati University obtained the license and frequency 90.8 MHz from the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Government of India for the establishment of the Community Radio Station in its campus. Radio Luit operates 12 hours daily between 8.00 am to 8.00 pm. In this radio station, students, faculty members of Gauhati University and people from the surrounding areas of Gauhati University, play active role in managing this station. Radio Luit has a simple policy where anyone from the community can participate and it encourages more community participation. Radio Luit creates content with the participation mostly of students and common people of its coverage area in various themes i.e. Educational, Health, Environment, Cultural and Community Development as priority areas.

Radio Luit is not for profit and endeavours to provide a mechanism for facilitating students, teachers, non-teaching staff, their family members and the members of the community hailing from the surrounding areas to tell their own diverse stories, to share experiences in a media rich world and to become active creators and contributors of media. This radio station covers an area of approximately 15 km of radius from the premises of GUCDOE where the studio is situated.

Let's see some of the activities from 2016 onwards. After concluding a capacity building workshop and baseline survey, Radio Luit started a one year project from of March, 2016 on 'Science for Women's Health and Nutrition'. This project was catalyzed by the NCSTC, DST, Govt. of India.
